

Executive Order on collection of payment from international students participating in the Danish Ministry of Culture's tertiary education programmes

The following provisions are laid down pursuant to section 13(2) of the Danish Act on Tertiary Artistic Education Institutions under the auspices of the Ministry of Culture, cf. Consolidation Act No. 889 of September 21, 2000, and section 5(2) of the Danish Act No. 17 of January 14, 1998 on the Royal School of Library and Information Science:

Chapter 1

Scope

1.-(1) This Executive Order covers the collection of payment from international students at the following institutions:

- The Aarhus School of Architecture
- The Royal School of Library and Information Science
- The Danish School of Design
- The National Film School of Denmark
- Designskolen Kolding
- The Carl Nielsen Academy of Music
- The Royal Academy of Music, Aarhus
- The Royal Danish Academy of Music
- The Glass and Ceramic School on Bornholm
- The Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts, School of Architecture
- The Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts, Schools of Visual Arts
- The Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts, School of Conservation
- The Academy of Music, Aalborg
- The Rhythmic Music Conservatory
- The Danish National School of Theatre
- The Academy of Music and Music Communication

(2) The Minister for Culture may decide that this Executive Order is also to apply to other education institutions under the auspices of the Ministry of Culture.

(3) The institutions may organise special education programmes for fee-paying students comprised by section 2.

2. The institutions shall charge full tuition fees for international students participating in full-time and part-time education programmes unless the student:

- 1) has been granted a permanent residence permit or a temporary residence permit with the possibility of permanent residence in Denmark,
- 2) has been exchanged with a Danish student according to an agreement between the institution and an institution abroad or is a guest student at the institution as arranged through Fulbright or Denmark's International Study Program (DIS),
- 3) has a right under Community law, including the EEA Agreement, or international agreements, including cultural agreements, entered into by Denmark to be treated on a par with Danish citizens, or
- 4) participates in an Erasmus Mundus programme.

Chapter 2

Payment

3. The institutions lay down rules for payment of tuition fees, including deadlines for payment of the tuition fee.
4. The institutions shall prepare a basis of calculation for use in fixing the tuition fee. The fee is fixed in such a way that the education institution will obtain cover for at least the average cost per student. The Ministry of Culture may obtain information about the basis of calculation.

Chapter 3

Entry into force

5. This Executive Order enters into force on January 1, 2008 and has effect for students commencing a full-time or part-time education programme after January 1, 2008.
